

Flying Drones at Work

(legally and safely)

Does this apply to me?

Yes - If you fly drones commercially or at work, there are some obvious and not-soobvious requirements. To find out more, read our summary...

So, what do I need to know?

The Law on flying drones is changing on 30th July and sets requirements for flying.

What do I need to do?

- 1. Obtain Permission from the Civil Aviation Authority (you will probably need to attend their training course).
- 2. Fly your drone below 400 feet (120 metres)
- 3. Keep your drone in sight and within range
- 4. Do not fly over a congested area, or within set distances of people structures and vehicles
- 5. Keep away from airports and aircraft
- 6. If you are filming, take care to meet relevant privacy laws
- 7. Follow the manufacturer's instructions

Other considerations;

- 1. Power failure
- 2. Weather
- 3. Flight paths
- 4. Other drones and people
